Learning Outcomes	<p>To understand better, what domestic violence is, and the current definition used in the UK</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be able to define Domestic Abuse as physical violence, sexual violence, psychological or emotional abuse, financial or economic abuse, coercive control and stalking and harassment. • Be able to appreciate the physical, psychological and physiological impact of domestic abuse on those who experience it and how it affects their behaviours and choices • Develop an awareness of the dynamics and magnitude of rape and sexual assault; both within intimate relationships and stranger rape/sexual assault. • Recognise the myths and realities faced by victims and survivors of domestic abuse and sexual assault • Be able to clearly understand that Domestic Abuse is targeted, look out for early signs of it, and learn that there are no excuses for perpetrating abuse. • Understand how abusers will misuse any power and control over a victim – using the Duluth Power & Control Wheel • Develop confidence and skills when dealing with disclosures of domestic abuse, rape and sexual assault.
